





Highlights from the Fall Leadership Meeting; Brown Hotel, Louisville, Kentucky



September 21-24

In addition to traditional reports from NLASAR officers, first vicepresident Becky Osbourn shared that the NLASAR bylaws will be revised. Then our LAPASSAR President, Becky Moyer with Keitha Callanan, provided a progress report on plans for the 2024 Congress to be held in Lancaster, Pennsylvania. Registration opened in May, and the hotel is 72% full (as of this meeting time). To register, go to the NSSAR website (https://www.sar.org/). Sign in (with your husband's password), then choose "events" from the top toolbar drop-down. This takes you to Congresses; choose 2024 Lancaster. To register, click on "Hotel Registration Link." This

link takes you to the page to register which includes a map of the hotel's surrounding area as well as the registration form for Lancaster Marriott at Penn Square. Room fee is \$149.00 plus taxes. Absolute deadline for registration is June 17, 2024. A schedule of events is also included, and you will notice that events are two days later than usual because the hotel could not initially accommodate us for the dates we wanted.

During the business portion of the NLASAR meeting, attendees also learned that \$2,087, 427 was raised for construction of the SAR Education Center and Museum and \$1,762,638 has been pledged for a total of \$3,850,065! The National Society's website boasts a TripAdvisor 2020 ranking of our Genealogical Research Library as in the top 10% of all attractions worldwide based upon visitor experience!

The next portion of the NLASAR meeting included a presentation of "A Stitch in Time" presented by award-winning quilter, Peggy Anderson. Peggy's quilt filled an entire wall! See photograph of her art work on page ten. The ladies' luncheon at fall leadership included a trip to the Frazier Museum which focuses on history of Kentucky.
